





People were frozen in molten asphalt, aflame. Nurses dragged crippled patients to the Elbe River. Bombers on the second wave of attack could see the fire from 500 miles away. Pilots returned to strafe refugees.




WTF IS A SIEGE?

The siege was the preferred military practice of the day and involved three techniques:

Investment: The surrounding of an enemy fort or town with an army to prevent entry or escape and cut off supplies and reinforcements.

Circumvallation: The building of ramparts and entrenchments to encircle a besieged city.

Contravallation: The building of entrenchments protecting the circumvallation line from outside attack.



Gettysburg

For three days in July, 160,000 Americans murdered and maimed each other with musket and bayonet and bare-knuckled blows under a rain of cannon fire in the Battle of Gettysburg. Bronze guns called "Napoleons" hurled 12-pound iron balls over a mile in distance. The Whitworth Breechloading Rifle launched a twelve-pound bolt two miles. The din from the artillery barrage was heard 140 miles away in Pittsburg. Army surgeons sawed away under tents and made piles of discarded arms and legs. Two thirds of battlefield deaths were from infection and disease. 5,000 horses and mules died in the battle. Funeral fires smoldered for weeks. Glory. Gory.



Hiroshima

Hell on Earth. The citizens of Hiroshima were told to "expect a rain of ruin from the air." An atomic bomb named *Little Boy* fell from a bomber named *Enola Gay* and delivered a blinding flash and unleashed a tsunami of death. The storm of fire and gamma radiation formed a furnace two miles in diameter. Souls not cremated instantly died over days and weeks from radiation sickness. Hospitals and doctors had vaporized with the rest. Survivors were called "ant-walking alligators." Their skin had been seared from their skulls, leaving a black, leathery blob with a red hole where the mouth had once been. They could not scream.

The Peloponnesian War

Athens versus Sparta. Things just got real. Greek warfare, once a formal affair with peltasts and archers arrayed in phalanxes, became a fully capitalized, professional onslaught on civilians. Navies of hundreds of ships roved the Aegean Sea, besieging populations. Mercenaries – skirmishers, sailors, and siege engineers – set new standards for brutality. Well renumerated and thorough, they raped and murdered, set cities on fire, and generally laid waste. The island of Melos was neutral in the conflict but saw its men murdered and its women and children sold into slavery.

Wounded Knee

The 7th Cavalry captured Spotted Elk's band of Lakota near Porcupine Butte and led them to Wounded Knee Creek. The encampment was surrounded by troops supported by a battery of four Hotchkiss mountain guns. Black Coyote wouldn't surrender his rifle, claiming he had paid a lot for it. A scuffle ensued, a shot was fired, and the 7th Cavalry opened fire indiscriminately from all sides, killing men, women, and children, as well as some of their own comrades. Little boys came out of hiding and were butchered with swords, mowed down as they ran. When it was over, more than 150 men, women, and children had been killed. Twenty soldiers were awarded the medal of Honor.







A Note on the Alphabet

This book uses the NATO phonetic alphabet. It was developed by the military to enable better understanding of voice messages in radio and telephone communication, especially when language barriers or poor transmission quality are an issue.

It is also known as a spelling alphabet, and employs *acrophony*, the naming of a letter with a word that begins with the letter itself. Greek letter names are acrophonic: *alpha*, *beta*, *gamma*, *delta*.
